

Earagail 2005...lt's Time!

The Ultimate Preview

Kate Chambré has a look at what's on offer at the Earagail Arts Festival 2005.

This year the seventeenth Earagail Arts Festival takes place from 4th to 17th July, when over 100 colourful events will be staged at thirty-eight venues across North Donegal. Over fourteen days and nights from Malin to Dungloe, thousands of people are expected to travel around the county to check out some of the best shows happening in Ireland this summer. Catering to a wide range of ages, the Festival programme includes a superb combination of music, theatre, comedy, outdoor family and children's events, exhibitions, films, talks and workshops, performed by local and international artists.

The exciting variety of artists who will be taking part come from countries all over the world, including South Africa, Holland, America, Brazil, England, Scotland, France, Russia and Ireland.

Festival Highlights

Oidhreacht (Legacy) is a series of concerts celebrating the life and work of Leo and Baba Brennan whose family have made an extraordinary contribution to the musical heritage of Donegal. This heritage has given us Clannad, Moya Brennan and Enya, among others, who have achieved global recognition as solo musicians and band members. The concerts will feature members of their extended family including Moya Brennan and band, Clannad and Cór Mhúire Doire Beaga and special guests Paddy Cole All Stars.

Direct from South Africa, The Farber Foundry's **Amajuba: Like Doves We Rise** received critical acclaim and standing ovations when it toured at the prestigious Barbican theatre and Edinburgh Fringe Festival, where it won a top award. This exceptional play about the South African apartheid bears testimony to the extraordinary spirit present in South Africa despite the past devastation. Being the only Irish performances and Irish premiere, early booking is essential for this event.



kaleidoscope". The order of the sequence has meaning; it is the order in which the corresponding mental images occurred to my mind. Often for instance, I start with strong and dense paintings and end up with very light works which might have seemed meaningless if they were not the end point of a sequence, or on the contrary, my paintings can get more and more dense until I feel totally immersed by them.

Time being an essential element of my paintings, I was led naturally to work with composers, music being the art of time. I have thus been collaborating for more than fifteen years with composers of MIM (Musique et Informatique de Marseille).

In this time, we have produced numerous music-painting works with either music created by composers from a painting of mine or conversely me painting from their music. We produced in particular a CD-rom 'Peintures Parcourues' (Paintings Perused) made up from 400 of my paintings distributed in seven sequences, one for each of the composers of MIM. This CD turns out to be a natural framework for some of the characters of my painting that I have described above.

In 'Paintings Perused' each elementary painting in a sequence may be considered as complete in itself, however the painting we wish to consider is the sequence in its totality and not one of its elements, (just as a conventional painting is often built by degrees, layer upon layer, as if several pictures were resting one upon another). This sequence, is a spacetime painting, which like music creates a flow of sensations all the more, as music gives a beginning and an end to the flow of elementary paintings of the sequence.

Each of these space-time paintings seems to me to respond to what Delacroix longed for: "We should make sketch-paintings with the spontaneity and directness of a sketch".

Each elementary painting in the sequence is spontaneous like a sketch, the sequence itself has the richness of a painting.







While exploring the relationship between art and science, Time, an unprecedented exhibition series normally reserved for national museums will feature the priceless work of some of the world's most famous artists. These artists include: Jacques Mandelbrojt, Bill Viola, John Cage, Tacita Dean, Richard Long, Bridget Riley, Sam Francis, Hérve Nahon, Rachel Lowe and Victor Vasarely. Exhibition venues include Letterkenny Arts Centre, The Glebe Gallery, Donegal County Museum and An Grianán Theatre.

Music Highlights

This year's Festival opens with an original concert featuring the hugely popular West Ocean String Quartet and Paddy Glackin with Micheal Ó Domhnaill at An Grianán Theatre on Monday 4th July. Especially commissioned by the Festival, the concert will include new music for fiddle from French composers Lucie Prod'homme, and Marcel Formosa as well as Robert Coinel's piece for piccolo and percussion played by celebrated French musicians Jean-Louis Beaumandier and Richard Arapian. These two musicians will also perform at the launch of the Time exhibitions the following day at the Letterkenny Arts Centre. Music features strongly over the first weekend of the Festival when top musicians from all over the world, bring their different musical styles to a variety of venues from Culdaff to Dunlewy.

You can see the immensely talented folk singer Kathryn Williams, one of Dido and Nora Jones' favourite singer-songwriters, perform in Letterkenny, or check out Woodstock legend Richie Havens in Culdaff, whose voice has inspired millions of people all over the world. Also in Culdaff, you'll have the chance to hear one of Ireland's most famous Uilleann pipers Liam O'Flynn & The Pipers Call Band. In Ballybofey, there's the rare opportunity to see singer-songwriter Pierce Turner (whose fans include Ireland's soccer manager Brian Kerr and Hollywood actor Brad Pitt) while Koshka & Caroline Moreau will deliver an explosive mix of foot-stamping gypsy tunes and exquisitely sung numbers from the classic French repertoire. Brazil's answer to Rodrigo Y Gabrielle, Tudo Concorda, will





play the same venue. In Ramelton leading Irish band the Saw Doctors are guaranteed to live up to their legendary reputation when they perform their usual rabble-rousing gig. And for all you traditional Irish music lovers out there, there will be an excellent session in Dunlewy by the skilful Lillis Ó Laoire and Dominic MacGiolla Bhríde. Kevin Doherty will perform a special gig along with Gerry 'banjo' O Connor at the same venue.

Theatre & Performance Highlights

There is a fantastic variety of touring theatre and children's shows in this year's programme, visiting a variety of venues throughout the Festival catchment area. Although Donal O'Kelly's brilliant new play The Cambria is set in 1845, the story line bears remarkable relevance to the plight of asylum seekers in Ireland today, leaving audiences with real food for thought. The distinguished Balor Theatre Company will also be touring the county with Coronation Street scriptwriter Catherine Hayes' play Skirmishes, which has proved very popular so far. The Cloughaneely Players present High Noon in Falcarragh while Belfast's Cello Productions bring a new Una Woods play, Grace Before Meals to Gortahork.

This year there are some excellent touring children's shows, including the enchanting fairy tale Witchin' Well by Rathmullan-based Joe Brennan, which has been especially commissioned by An Grianán Theatre for the Festival. There's the wonderfully imaginative Show for all Seasons by Seán Ó Laoghaire and Ailie Cohen's hilarious one-woman musical puppet show Jazz Mouse, featuring a groovy Parisian rodent. The Irish language production Codladh Céad Bliain, an adaptation of Sleeping Beauty will be a real treat for children in Falcarragh and Downings.

The National Theatre of Ireland's new play by **Tom Mac Intyre**, **What Happened Bridgie Cleary** - a powerful story based on events surrounding the barbaric murder of a women who was burned alive for alleged witchcraft - will be running for three nights at

Outdoor, Children & Family Highlights


As always, Festival time has many fun-filled events geared towards family audiences. Be on the lookout from Friday 8th to Wednesday 13th July - for a bright orange and partly green Cinemobile, which will be zooming around six coastal locations. From Dungloe to Malin through Gweedore, Falcarragh, Downings and Rathmullan it will show a superb programme of children's films and a series of predominantly Irish film shorts, suitable for all the family.

Over the second weekend of the Festival, kids will be very excited, if not a little curious, when they meet Dirk, a hilarious world-travelling tramp, and will delight in The Grand Mini Theatre of Compagnie de Draak, La Fanfare Jo Bithume and Les Filfilles Font du Firk. These lively outdoor touring shows from Holland



and France which combine comedy, music, puppetry, circus acts and clowning can be seen in Letterkenny Town Park and Falcarragh (during carnival day).

Tummies will start rumbling when up to twenty-three traders from the French Traditional Market set up shop in Letterkenny Town Park on Friday 15th and Saturday 16th July, selling countless mouth-watering delicacies from their country as well as a great selection of arts and crafts. Hopefully tummies won't be rumbling when England's Chapterhouse Theatre Company present their spectacular Elizabethan outdoor production of A Midsummer Night's Dream in the Town Park on Saturday evening, as friends and families are invited to picnic while watching the performance. In a world full of Play Stations, televisions, and other indoor distractions, it's a refreshing change to see whole communities get involved in projects like Loinnir and An Paráid Mór. These hugely successful Falcarragh-based community projects, also take place over the last weekend of the Festival with An Cosán Glas beautifully illuminated sculpture trail on Magheroarty Beach while Cosa Meata Carnival Group will participate in the Falcarragh Parade.



Talks & Workshops Highlights

The Festival presents a unique opportunity to hear Irish Playwright **Tom Mac Intyre** and South African Director **Yael Farber** talk about their life and work in two separate late evening talks. On top of this Yael Farber will lead an afternoon workshop for actors and performers. There are also a series of creative workshops for children and teenagers.
