But just 400 will see Godfather star

HE'S best known for playing flawed men of greatness whose efforts to shake off a murky past

flawed men of greatness whose efforts to shake off a murky past are hampered at every turn.

So when it emerged that Al Pacino was due to hit Dublin, it came as no surprise to learn that our top politicians and celebrities were falling over themselves to meet him.

But with just 400 students receiving tickets to see the Godfather legend at Trinity College, Dublin, let's just say such aspirations sleep with the fishes.

The actor is due to fly into Dublin next Wednesday to accept honorary patronage of the university's Philosophical Society.

And just 400 students – selected by lottery – have been invited to witness the 66-year-old actor acknowledge the honour bestowed on him by "The Phil'. Not that that has stopped the great and the good trying to gain access to the event, according to TCD's debating club the Philosophical Society.

'People have literally been banging down the doors to get a ticket,' said society president Daire Hickey.

The unprecedented demand stems from a decision by the society to keep the event a low-key affair and resist the temptation to open their doors to the darlings of the society pages.

'We decided not to invite any celebrites or politicians,' Mr Hickey told the Daily Mail, adding that there had been

an 'unbelievable' response to the anticipated arrival of the New York icon.

Pacino - who co-starred with Colin Farrell in 2003's The Recruit - follows in the footsteps of such prominent figures as Archbishop Desmond Tutu, Bob Geldof and Salman Rushdie.

The society sent a letter to the Serpico star's agent in June, and received a response within a fortnight.



in a production of Wilde's play Salome. Now 20-year-old Mr Hickey is putting in place the last-minute preparations ahead of the acting veteran's 48-hour visit to Dublin.

'Before the event he'll have dinner at Trinity College with the provost John Hegarty, myself and a couple of members from the Philosophical Society,' said the economics student.

'We're delighted he's taking the time to come here. It really is truly an honour. I'm not sure if he has visited Ireland before but I'm sure he'll enjoy his trip.'
