

Pilgrim's body found in remote undergrowth

MYSTERY last night continued to surround the final hours of Winnie Brady, who vanished while on a pilgrimage to Medjugorje.

Despite the discovery of her body in remote undergrowth on Sunday, the circumstances in which the Dublin grandmother disappeared are no clearer than

they were four months ago when she first went missing. Mrs Brady, 59, was on her third visit to the town on September 6 when she vanished without explanation.

Despite extensive searches involving family members and police with tracker dogs, no trace of her was found until yesterday when a hunter found her remains.


The site is some three kilometres from the guesthouse where Mrs

Brady was staying. As her husband Stephen files out to Bosnia this morning to formally identify the remains, sources close to the investigation have told the Irish Daily Mail that her death is believed to have been brought about by natural causes.

But the following questions remain unanswered:
