With its pebble-paved walls, maze of narrow cobbled streets, vaulted passageways and steep meandering incline, the medieval village of Haut-de-Cagnes is a magical place to simply get away from it all says KATE CHAMBRE.

THE large wooden door opens, and I am invited into a beautiful oasis situated in a small 14th century medieval village, in the heart of the

Minutes later, I am reclining on a chair in the glorious sun, glass of rosé in hand, with a platter of cured hams and cheeses before me. Meanwhile, Pudsey, the resident cat is sprawled out on a nearby window sill, occasionally glancing down at the new arrivals on the terrace.

He hasn't a care in the world, nor should he, as he couldn't have chosen a better place to live if

Villa Estelle, purchased under a year ago by Claire Geddis and Stephen Hill from Belfast, is just a 10 to 15 minute drive from Nice Airport and is situated along the Côte d'Azur, in the heart of one of the most historic and picture perfect villages of the region.

Over the years the medieval village of Haut-de-Cagnes, classed as a "Monument of France", has attracted a host of artists who were drawn to the place because of its captivating Mediterranean light. In fact, the village earned itself the nickname "the Montmartre of the French Riviera" and attracted celebrities from the world of arts and show business particularly up until

Among the most famous people to spend time in Haut-de-Cagnes were the painter Renoir, the writer Jean Cocteau and legendary film star Brigitte Bardot.

Nowadays the village, with its panoramic views, monuments and sites, and exquisite restaurants is less glitz and glam, and more gentile. It is also the perfect base from which to explore the surrounding region, which takes in Nice, Cannes, Monte Carlo, Eze, and many other tourist destinations.

While visiting Haut-de-Cagnes, there is no better place to stay than Villa Estelle, situated on montée de la Bourgade, a street, which every August plays host to the World Square Boules Championships no less.

The child and dog-friendly guesthouse, which could also be classed as a boutique hotel, is warm and inviting, with an interior décor, that oozes a feeling of relaxation. Its wonderful blend of historic and contemporary furniture - mock

bookcase and secret room included - add to the

wonder of the place.
The guesthouse's five en-suite rooms are exceptionally cosy, offering visitors an ideal haven to chill out and totally relax and unwind. While staying at Villa Estelle, I slept in the honeymoon suite, which included a luxurious marble bath and separate shower, a huge bed, TV and DVD, mini bar and private balcony. Heaven! Part of the reason why the guesthouse is so inviting is down to the warm and bubbly personality of Fiona Kennedy, originally from Holywood, who manages the place. Since taking on the job eight months ago Fiona, who is a fluent French speaker, has clearly put her heart and soul into making guests feel yery much at and soul into making guests feel very much at home during their stay.

The three-star guesthouse, formally owned by the renowned interior designer Estelle Réale, has gone from strength to strength since it was taken over by its new owners, and has proved a particularly popular destination among holidaymakers from Northern Ireland and the Republic.

Plans are now in the pipe-line to build a swimming pool at Villa Estelle, which will undoubtedly enhance what it already has to offer. However, for the time-being if visitors feel like a dip in the water, the sea is a stone's throw away, in nearby Cagnes-sur-Mer.

If you're feeling really energetic, why not pack your running shoes, and jog down to Cagnes-sur-Mer and along the promenade. Just try not to get lost like I did! I found that the exercise, alongside walking up and down the steep hills of Haut-de-Cagnes steep hills, was not only a great way to explore the surrounding area but burn off that delicious meal I had the night before at Le Village, a busy brasserie next to the chateau.
